

lamorgan Dragons coach Jeff Hammond is out to breathe fire back into the Welsh County's Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two campaign as the 2000 season enters its second half. The Dragons are well placed to launch an assault on promotion to Division One, after a promising opening to the season which has seen the side claim four victories and amass 20 points.

The year did not get off to the start Hammond and captain Matthew Maynard would have wished for, with a 10-run reverse to Surrey Lions in Cardiff at the end of April putting a dampener on early-season dreams of an improvement on last season's fourthplaced finish. That was followed by a bitterly disappointing nine-wicket mauling bv

Warwickshire Bears at Edgbaston, when Nick Knight led the way with 68 to easily overhaul the Dragons' paltry 125.

But the rot stopped as successive victories over Durham Dynamos and Derbyshire Scorpions injected a much-needed dose of confidence into the Glamorgan Dragons camp, and Hammond succeeded in turning the season round. After a tied match with Middlesex Crusaders at Lord's, Essex Eagles and Hampshire Hawks were both put to the sword.

But just as Dragons' fans were thinking how rosy the 2000 campaign was becoming, there was a substantial blip. The side travelled to The Oval a fortnight ago and allowed Surrey Lions to amass a huge 268 from 45 overs. Ian Ward opened and battered 90

runs, while Adam Hollioake smashed 111 to put the hosts very much in the driving seat. Glamorgan Dragons' reply of 201 all out was a decent attempt at overhauling the total, but were undermined by too many poor batting performances.

Now Hammond will aim to slash the fourpoint gap to the third and final promotion place, starting with struggling Durham Dynamos' trip to Cardiff.

Then the Dragons' Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two run-in hots up with a must-win journey to rock-bottom Hampshire Hawks. Glamorgan Dragons followers will be keeping their fingers crossed Hammond can mastermind a stirring response from the mauling by the Lions.

ssex Eagles have suddenly gained altitude and begun to fly high in the Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two.

Until a month ago, their hopes of a decent placing come September were as dead as a dodo. But dreadful early-season form gave way to a sparkling trio of matches that re-ignited dreams of a memorable season in the second division. On June 25, the Eagles travelled to Edgbaston to take on Warwickshire Bears. And they left with a 24run victory, thanks largely to the efforts of their bowlers, who claimed all ten Bears wickets for just 139 runs.

Paul Grayson was the pick of the bowlers, with impressive figures of three for 21. Then

Middlesex Crusaders came to Chelmsford and Stuart Law showed just what he is capable of with a sparkling unbeaten 104 providing the backbone of the Eagles response to the home side's 213 from their allotted 45 overs. Law demolished the Bears' bowling attack, taking just 96 balls to pile up his runs and the Eagles claimed a seven-wicket win and put four points in the bag.

And after a three-week gap before their next Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two date against Derbyshire Scorpions at Chelmsford's County Ground, the Eagles showed how keen they were to get back into action with a hard-fought sixrun victory. Danny Law grabbed three wickets for 41 runs to give the hosts the edge.

The Scorpions did not help their cause by gifting the Eagles four run-outs, but Ronnie Irani's side are now on a roll. Just ten points cover the teams placed from second to sixth in the division, so Irani will be issuing a battle cry as two ties with the rock bottom Hampshire Hawks loom into view.

Derbyshire Scorpions are also at the wrong end of the table, and the Eagles have a day at Derby inbetween the matches with the Hawks. Essex Eagles fans will hope Irani & Co make the most of the matches with the struggling Hawks and Scorpions, so that a finish in the top three spots - securing promotion to Norwich Union National Cricket League Division One - could become a reality.



Urham Dynamos skipper Nick Speak must have breathed a massive sigh of relief when his side finally came into form to claim victories in their Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two games with Derbyshire Scorpions and Middlesex Crusaders.

Until the start of July, the northern county looked in grave danger of earning the wooden spoon two seasons in a row. A run of four defeats on the bounce led to some Chesterle-Street regulars fearing the worst. But those early-season blues were banished when the Dynamos' 2000 campaign got into gear with a scrambled triumph over Essex Eagles at Ilford. Simon Katich piled up 61 runs from 120 deliveries, while Jonathan Lewis added some middle-order clout with a quickfire 60 from just 72 balls. Their efforts steered the Dynamos to a total of 182 from 45 overs, and Ian Hunter broke down the hosts' reply (175 all out) with a handy bowling return of four for 29. A couple of defeats followed, but the Dynamos came back into form with a thumping 95-run triumph over Derbyshire Scorpions at Darlington on July 2, followed last week by a 50-run win over Warwickshire Bears at Edgbaston.

After that win, coach Norman Gifford had much to thank Katich for. He again led the way, with a 64-run barrage from 86 balls. Paul Collingwood played an admirable supporting role, racking up 53 runs from 87 deliveries. Now Gifford is hoping his side take a few more maximum-point hauls to boost their third-from-bottom position.

There is an eight-point gap to strugglers Derbyshire Scorpions and Hampshire Hawks, but Gifford will hope to cut the sixpoint difference to the Essex Eagles, currently one place above them. So he will be firing up the team for the clash with mid-table Glamorgan Dragons at Cardiff, before a trio of home matches that will have a major say on where the Dynamos end up this season.

Warwickshire Bears are the first visitors, followed by Essex Eagles and Hampshire Hawks. The Dynamos' final action of their Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two season is against Surrey Lions and Derbyshire Scorpions.

or Derbyshire Scorpions supporters, their 2000 Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two campaign is turning into a severe case of deja vu.

Last year, the Midlands county limped home to finish eighth in the second tier. And after nine matches played by Dominic Cork's side so far this term, there has been little evidence to suggest a higher-placed finish will be achieved this season. The Scorpions' sole triumph was a 15-run win over Middlesex Crusaders at Lord's six weeks ago. On that occasion, Cork put in a real captain's performance with 64 runs from 111 balls. And Paul Aldred and Matthew Cassar did the damage when the Crusaders were batting, both recording three-wicket hauls.

But there has been little else to cheer for

Derbyshire Scorpions followers. Cricket manager Colin Wells has done his utmost to rally the troops, but the league table at the half-way stage of the 2000 Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two season does not make pleasant reading. The club are level bottom with Hampshire Hawks, with only a better run-rate keeping them clear of the basement spot.

The Scorpions have batted second in their last four league fixtures, but have been unable to sustain a high-enough run-rate to keep them in contention. Nottinghamshire Outlaws won the Midlands derby by 30 runs, then Durham Dynamos seized an embarrassing 95-run victory. Warwickshire Bears grabbed the four points with a 45-run win, before the Scorpions lost an agonising runchase against Essex Eagles at Chelmsford. Replying to the Eagles' 203, eight Scorpions batsmen made it to double figures, but none managed to hit more than 34, leaving the side stranded on 197 when the final wicket fell.

Now Cork and Wells must raise the spirits in the camp, with fellow strugglers Hampshire Hawks the next team to arrive at Derby. A week later, mid-table Essex Eagles come to town, then Wells must convince his team they can take something from the daunting trip to runaway leaders Surrey Lions at The Oval. The Scorpions will be hoping they can improve their form to claim a mid-table finish.

When Shane Warne was unveiled as the man to steer Hampshire Hawks to glory in Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two, there was a belief around Northlands Road that the Australian spin king really would be the man to help the county emerge from the wilderness and become a real force.

But it has not happened. Warne has grabbed 14 wickets in the competition, the best return of any Hampshire bowler, but the batsman have not responded to Warne's efforts with the ball and his geeing-up in the dressing room. The result is that Hampshire Hawks prop up the Norwich Union National Cricket League Division Two. And with just one win in nine outings, director of cricket Tim Tremlett knows he has much to do as the 2000 season passes the half-way point.

The county's sole victory was the 18-run win over lowly Durham Dynamos at Basingstoke on June 18. And that owed much to former captain John Stephenson, who concentrated on his batting to smash 83 runs to guide the county to 222 for five. Alan Mullally was the hero of the hour with four wickets for 40 runs, from nine overs.

There were two half-centuries in the Dynamos' innings, but only one other batsman got into double figures, as the Hawks claimed a desperately-needed narrow victory.

But that was a month-and-a-half ago, and those six weeks have brought three defeats,

the last of which - against Middlesex Crusaders at Portsmouth - was extremely disappointing. Hampshire Hawks' top five batsmen all made it to double figures, but not one settled and rattled up a big enough knock to secure victory. As it was, the Hawks made 190 and allowed the visitors to claim a four-wicket victory.

Coach Jimmy Ćook will now be stirring up his side for the visit of mid-table Essex Eagles to Southampton. That match is followed by the crunch meeting with joint-bottom Derbyshire Scorpions, at Derby on August 6. Tremlett, Cook and captain Robin Smith know that match is a must-win if the side are to boost their chances of avoiding the wooden spoon.

HOW IT WORKS: The Norwich Union National League operates on a three-up, three-down basis with the top three finshers in Division Two replacing the bottom three of Division One.

Four points are awarded for a win, while teams will take two points each if matches are tied or the weather intervenes before the required number of overs have been completed and there is no result.

Revised playing hours come into effect this season with matches starting at 1pm and ending at 7.10pm with 45 overs per side, although all fixtures will begin 30 minutes earlier in September. Floodlit games will start at 4.10pm. The 'free-hit' rule for no balls will apply to front-foot no balls only this season. A batsman cannot be dismissed from the bowler's next delivery after such an infringement.

This season's competition features the biggest number of day-night matches yet staged in this country - 26 - with 16 out of the 18 counties hosting floodlit cricket.
